Weather adversely affects this trail. On exposed down hills, the trail can become icy, making descents very challenging.

The snowshoe trail is marked with white plastic disks with a blue snowshoe emblem. On the ridge, the snowshoe trail follows the AT hiking trail which is marked with white rectangular blazes painted on trees.

Pay careful attention!
The snowshoe trail leaves (left) the AT hiking trail approx. 1/4 mile after the lake overlook.

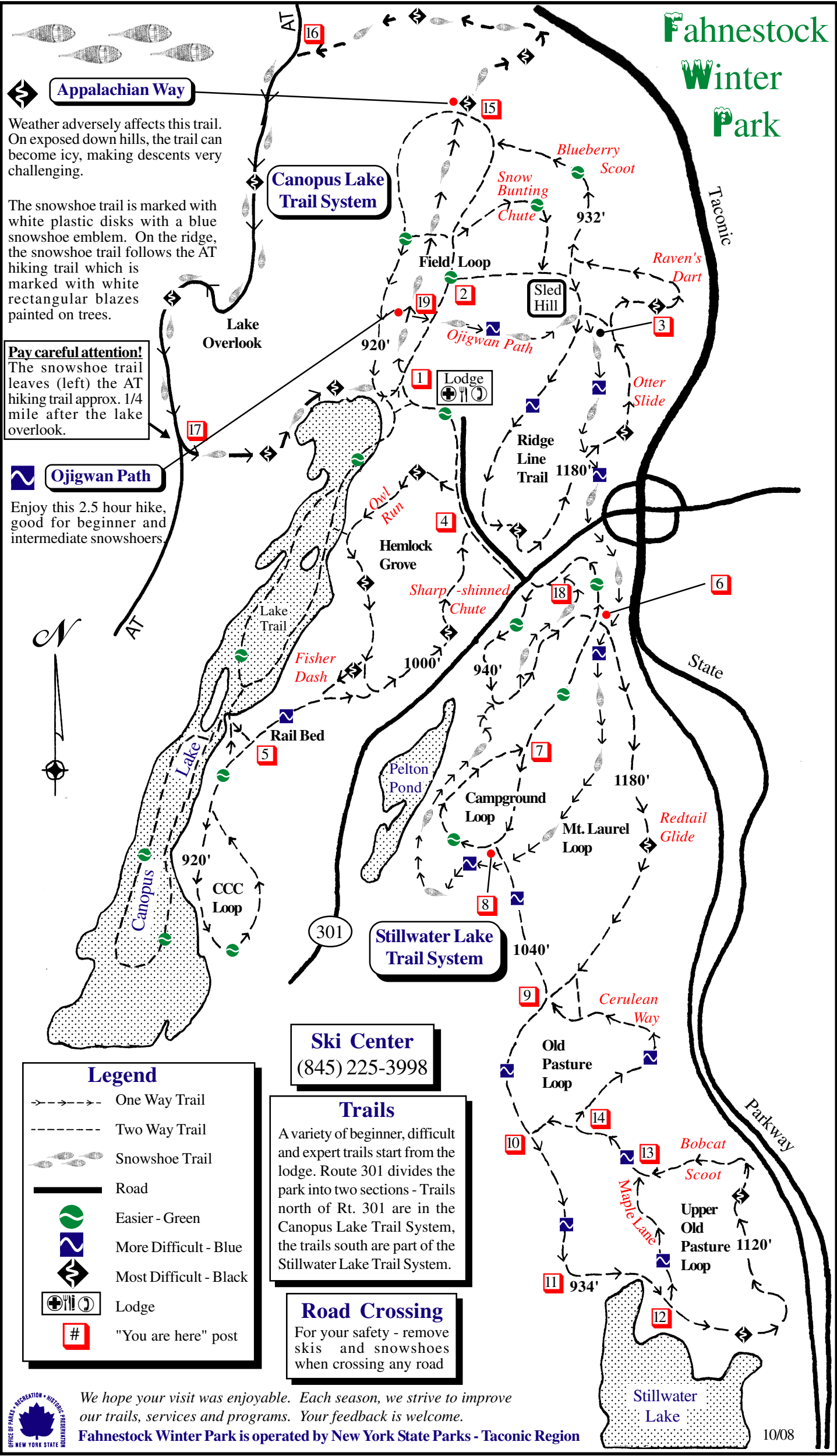
